Water Update: Another Step Closer

On Friday, January 19, President Phil Suit and Board Member Emily Pruitt, attended a hearing at the Travis County courthouse along with John Carlton, attorney for the Oak Forest Water System. It took less than ten minutes for a judge to decide that the Oak Forest Water System should be owned by the Oak Forest Water Supply Corporation (OFWSC)– that's you.

No date has been announced for the purchase of the system yet, and there are still a few details to attend to. President Suitt has been meeting with Texas Commission on Environmental Quality representatives and completing forms in an effort to expedite the process. If you would like to learn more about the status of the water system, make plans to attend the OFWSC annual meeting scheduled for March 13 at the Southern Hills Church of Christ, on FM 967 at 7:00 PM. We need 10% attendance by water customers at this meeting to conduct business.

Rains Offers Relief

The recent rains have brought much-needed water to the region. Onion Creek, which was dry for most of 2006, now flows gently under the FM 967 Bridge. And the aquifer received enough recharge for the Barton Springs Edwards Aquifer Conservation District (BSEACD) to change the drought status from Critical Stage to Alarm Stage. Good news. Yes, but keep in mind that the return to Alarm Stage Drought means we are still

required to reduce pumpage by 20% from non-drought monthly pumping amounts. Dr. Bob Larsen, BSEACD Board President, cautions all groundwater users, "This could be only a temporary reprieve from the more stringent restrictions of Critical Stage. Unless we get substantial amounts of more rain this spring, the District may re-enter Critical Stage as early as April or May."

The fact is that this region has a limited supply of groundwater and a growing number of straws siphoning that supply from the underground rivers that flow beneath our homes. The subdivisions that have sprung up in the last 10 years – Creekside, Cullen County, Bradfield Village, and Plum Creek, are pumping water from the aquifer at an unprecedented rate. The 1800 homes destined for the intersection of Hwy 967 and 1626, and the commercial development that will follow will increase the demand. And while the City of Buda just last year secured surface water from Canyon Lake, 70 miles to the southwest, they also purchased water rights from the Dahlstrom well, behind the school.

Conservation of water resources now will pay off later. This neighborhood can have an impact on that pressure. Use water wisely. Read your meter. Be aware of how much water you are using. Try to cut down. Plant native plants. They don't need as much irrigation. Report obvious leaks in the system to the operations company, PGMS. Uncontained Dogs

Hays County and the Oak Forest C&R's require dogs to be contained. Hays County specifically prohibits dogs running at large which is defined as not completely confined by a building, wall, or fence of sufficient strength or construction to restrain the animal except when a dog subject to these regulations is under the direct supervision of the owner and is:

- On a leash
- Held in the arms of the owner or within the limits of the owner's private property and is obedient that owner's verbal commands.
- Within an automobile or vehicle of its owners and properly restrained.
- Participating in a field trial, dog show, or obedience classes.

Our deed restrictions state that "all animals shall be contained within the lot lines either by fence, leash, or other comparable device. Animals shall not be allowed outside an owners lot."

These regulations are both for the safety of the residents as well as the safety of the animals. Animals running free might get hit by a car. Owners should also consider that although their dog is harmless, they don't appear harmless to a person walking in the neighborhood when an unfamiliar dog comes running toward them. It is even possible that your "harmless" dog might get hurt when they approach individuals that may have all sorts of good reasons to distrust an advancing animal.
